4. Application Qualifications

■ The applicant and his/her parents must have foreign citizenships.

* Applicants who hold Korean citizenship are not qualified for this program.

■ Applicants should be in good health, both mentally and physically, to stay in Korea for a long period of time.

* Applicants have to submit the Personal Medical Assessment (included in the application form) when he/she apply for this program, and then submit an Official Medical Examination Report issued in a hospital to NIIED after passing the NIIED Selection Committee (the 2nd Selection). A serious illness reflected in the examination results will be the main cause of disqualification from the scholarship.

■ Applicants must be under 40 years of age as of Sep. 1st, 2011 (born after Sep. 1st, 1971).

■ Applicants must hold a Bachelor's or Master's degree as of September 1, 2011.

* Applicants who have ever enrolled in the same program in Korea as the one they are applying for will be disqualified from the program. For example, an applicant who has previously enrolled in a master's program in Korea cannot apply for the KGSP Master's Program.

* Applicants who apply for the Master's program must hold a Bachelor's degree or a diploma that is equivalent to or higher than a Bachelor's degree.

* Applicants who apply for the Doctoral program must hold a Master's degree or a diploma that is equivalent to or higher than a Master's degree.

* Applicants who are expecting to obtain the relevant required degree or diploma by August 31st, 2011 must submit a certificate of degree or diploma expectation, and submit the official certificate of degree or diploma by September 1st, 2011.

■ Applicants must maintain a grade point average (G.P.A.) of at least 2.64 on a 4.0 scale, 2.80 on a 4.3 scale, 2.91 on a 4.5 scale or grades/marks/score of 80% or higher from the previously attended institution.

* If the transcript is not indicated in grades/marks/scores format, or is difficult to convert into percentages, attachment of official explanation from the attended institution is required.

■ Applicants who have Korean proficiency or English proficiency may be given preference.

■ Applicants who apply for natural science and technology program may be given preference.

6. Selection Criteria

- (1) Document review will be based on the submitted documents including the self introduction essay, study plan, recommendation letters, transcript and any other additional supplementary materials. Based on the documents submitted, applicant's academic ability, language ability, aspirations for study abroad, potential societal contribution, and anticipated contribution towards the relationship between the two countries will be evaluated for the purposes of selection.
- (2) Applicants selected from the document review process will be notified to attend an in-person or a phone interview.

7. Submitting Your Application

- (1) Download the Application Forms on the website (<http://www.useoul.edu>) – Notice - Admissions : **KGSP Application Guide for Graduate Students (2011 University Recommendation)**
- (2) Refer to Seoul National University website (<http://snu.ac.kr>) and complete the **Desired Program of Study (Appendix 1)**. Once completed, submit the form along with rest of the required application documents. Please note, changes and/or cancellations will not be permitted after the completion of documentation submission.

- ※ If there is any incorrect or false information on the application or any missing document, the applicant may be disqualified.

8. Duration of Scholarship

- Master's (01.09.2011 ~ 31.08.2014) : 1 yr. of Korean language + 2 yrs of Master's
- Doctoral (01.09.2011 ~ 31.08.2015) : 1 yr. of Korean language + 3 yrs of Doctoral

9. Korean Language Course

- All the scholars basically take one year of Korean language course in the designated language institution.
- Only the scholars who will have passed at least Level 3 of the Test of Proficiency in Korean (TOPIK) are permitted to start their master's or doctoral program.
- Scholars who do not pass at least TOPIK Level 3 after one year of Korean language course should complete an additional six-month coursework in the Korean language.
 - ※ Scholars who take the six months' additional course are disqualified from extending their scholarship term beyond the designated duration of their scholarship.
- Language Institution : Institutions designated by NIIED (to be announced)
- Exemption from the Korean language course requirement: Korean proficiency at TOPIK Level 5 or 6 (with certification).
 - ※ Scholars who are exempted from taking the Korean language course may take their degree course starting from September 1st, 2011 or March 1st, 2012.
 - ※ Scholars who pass at least TOPIK Level 5 during the language course and want to start their degree course on March 1st, 2012 should obtain permission from NIIED in advance.

10. Scholarship Payment

- Scholarship Period : same as the period of invitation.
- Payment:
 - ▷ Airfare: Round-trip economy class ticket.
 - ※ Airfare for entry will not be provided to scholars who already presently live in Korea for academic study or employment.
 - ※ The fees for domestic travel within a scholar's home country and for travel insurance to and from Korea will not be provided.
 - ▷ Monthly Allowance : 900,000 won (KRW) per month.
 - ▷ Research Allowance : 210,000 won for scholars in the humanities and social sciences; 240,000 won for scholars in natural and mechanic sciences, per semester.
 - ▷ Relocation (Settlement) Allowance : 200,000 won upon arrival
 - ▷ Language Training Fee : Full coverage
 - ▷ Tuitions : All admission fees are waived by the host institution. The tuition is paid by NIIED.
 - ▷ Dissertation Printing Costs : 500,000 ~ 800,000 won, depending on the actual costs.
 - ▷ Medical Insurance : 15,000 won per month will be provided (limited coverage).
 - ▷ Special funding for scholars who are proficient in the Korean language (TOPIK Level 5 or 6): 100,000 won per month (commencing from the degree program)

11. Important Notes for All Applicants

- Refer to Seoul National University website (<http://snu.ac.kr>) and complete the **Desired Program of Study form (Appendix 1)**. Once completed, submit the form along with rest of the required application documents. Please note, changes and/or cancellations will not be permitted after the completion of documentation submission.
- Applicants who have ever enrolled in the same program in Korea as the one they are applying for will be disqualified from the program. For example, an applicant who has previously enrolled in a master's program in Korea cannot apply for the KGSP Master's Program.
- Dual applications are not accepted. Applicants must apply for this program via only one Organization among Korean Embassy, Domestic University and Korean adoption association. If the applicant gets recommended from more than one University or Organization, he/she will be disqualified.
- Documents should be presented in their original form. Documents not in English or Korean must be accompanied by a complete English or Korean translation authenticated by the issuing institution.
- Submitted documents will not be returned to the applicants.
- Incomplete or incorrect documents may lead to application rejection or failure in the Selection Committee, and scholarship revocation if after entry into Korea.
- Applicants who are expected to graduate from their respective home undergraduate/graduate institutions by September 2011, should submit the certificate (or letter) of expected graduation. Applicants must submit the official certificate of graduation to NIIED by September 1st, 2011.
- Applicants must accurately fill out the health checklist truthfully. All successful candidates must take a medical exam after passing the 2nd Selection. In accordance with the requirements of the Korea Immigration Service and the KGSP Program, the candidates who are judged to be unfit for this program will not be accepted.
- Applicants may submit the copies of published papers, if available.
- Applicants may submit the copies of awards, if available.
- Applicants who have enrolled in a Korean university must submit one recommendation letter of the Head of the department additionally.
- Transferring to a different university is not permitted in any case after confirming the host university and also changing the department/major is not permitted in any case after submitting the application materials.
- Detailed account of individual admissions decision for each applicant cannot be disclosed.
- Additional documents may be required from the applicant, based on the policy of the specific college or department.
- Original documents should be submitted. Should they be unavailable, however, copies must be authorized by the originating institution before they are submitted.

Research Park
Approximately 1.15 million was invested in the state-of-the-art research facility. Facilities include the Industrial Research Building (BK Telecom, LG Electronics Research Center, Wipro (MBC Center), Research Support Facility Building and International Neuroscience Research Center are located on 30,000 square meters.

Seoul National University Library
Seoul National University Library is a research library. It holds more than 3 million volumes, 10,200 academic journals and 30,000 electronic journals. Special collections include social sciences, business administration, international studies, agriculture, life, medical and dental areas are located across campus.

Amphitheater
The Amphitheater at SNU can seat up to 2,000 people and is used for various events and performances. Organized by students of the university.

Student Center
With a total floor area of 18,570sqm, the Student Center is a operating center of student life on campus. It contains the office of student representation, student activity rooms, restaurant, cafe, book store, student shop, pharmacy, lounge, and other convenient facilities. The Student Center is also home to the Center for Campus Life and Culture, Public Health Center and other services frequently used by students.

1st Engineering Building
Designed to house the 1st Engineering Building, the 1st Engineering Building is the highest building on Seoul campus.

University Computer Center
The Computer Center operates the largest supercomputer for academic research in Korea and a nationwide broadband network. It has also developed an integrated administration information system (SIS) aimed to process tasks related to education, research and administration efficiently. Faculty, administrative staff and students can use high-end multimedia facilities for use of the University Computer Center.

Kyeongjakk
Originally founded as the royal library in 1378 in the rear garden of Cheonggyeong Palace by King Jeongjong, the Kyongjakk has not only served the king at all court sessions, sessions and outdoor sites, but has continued to expand. The Kyongjakk collections now contain over 200,000 items, such as the Annals of Korean Dynasty (Joseon Wangjo Sillok) and the Diary of the Office of Royal Secretaries (Gyeonggwanjeon), both designated UNESCO World Documentary Heritage. The Kyongjakk houses the Kyongjakk Institute for Korean Studies, a leading center of research, publication, and international interdisciplinary collaboration in Korean studies.

Jahayon
One of the most prominent spots on campus, 'Jahayon' literally means a pond surrounded by pine trees. The nearby 'Sungdeok' (Sungdeok, S.W.), a renowned 19th-century sculpture of the Joseon Dynasty.

University Museum
With holdings of over 2,000 fine paintings, gems, porcelains and other pieces of art, the Museum is a treasure trove of Korean artifacts and an elegant, in addition to a permanent exhibition of traditional arts and anthropological exhibits, it hosts special exhibitions and lectures open to students, faculty and staff members, and the general public. A constant flow of exhibition halls, a library, research lab and facilities for preservation of SNU traditions, as well as an auditorium with 200 seats, feature welcome.

Museum of Art
The new Museum of Art is a shining new addition to SNU campus. Designed by Hans Hollein, the art museum links the university with the local community. Its doors were first inside the six-story building (300 seats) approximately 1.6 billion won to create an organic link between exhibition halls, classrooms, library and lounge. SNU's operations represents the basic philosophy of the Museum of Art. Local community members are welcome to use the holdings and participate in ongoing events.

POBCO Sports Center
POBCO Sports Center contains an Olympic swimming pool, eight tennis courts, basketball court, and multipurpose fitness rooms. Wide-ranging recreational services are available for members. Showers, lockers and team facilities are located on the top and first floors.
